FY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program Amendments and Administrative Modifications

Ms. Johnson provided summary of the changes to the TIP that were requested by the following entities: Stearns County, City of St. Cloud, City of Sartell, City of Sauk Rapids, WACOSA, ConnectAbility of Minnesota, and MnDOT. Ms. Johnson noted public comment period ran from Dec. 30, 2020, through Jan. 29, 2021, and 11 online surveys were taken. Reactions were mostly positive, some participants indicated disapproval, but it was not clear why they disapproved. Ms. Johnson noted a revision to the original TAC memo was sent to members on Feb. 2, 2021 to address an administrative modification requested by MnDOT. Ms. Johnson requested board approval on proposed changes to the TIP.

Ms. Teich made a motion to approve proposed changes to the TIP. Mr. Byrd seconded the motion. Motion carried. Roll Call: Kedrowski– YES; Voss – YES; Foss – YES; Glaesman – YES; Sabart – YES; Noerenberg – YES; Byrd – YES; Witter – YES; Teich – YES; Hedlund – YES; Saehr – YES

FY 2025 ATP-Managed Surface Transportation Block Grant Program Prioritization

Ms. Johnson summarized FY 2025 Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBGP) solicitations. Saint Cloud APO is expected to receive \$2,135,120 in Federal funding for fiscal year 2025. The APO received six applications: City of Sartell 15th Street North expansion, Stearns County CSAH 81 resurfacing, Stearns County CSAH 133 resurfacing, City of Saint Cloud 22nd Street South reconstruction, City of Sauk Rapids Second Avenue South reconstruction, and Sherburne County CR 65/45 Avenue realignment. Ms. Gruber presented the City of Sartell application for the 15th Street North Corridor expansion from Pinecone Road North to 19th Avenue North, requesting \$2,500,000 from Federal funds. Ms. Gruber noted that this application is for phase one of the project. Concerns include safety, East-West connection, expanded development in Sartell, school district and community driven, accessibility and mobility. Ms. Gruber showed traffic volumes based off APO traffic counts (2017) and noted they have increased due to the high school being built in north Sartell. Ms. Gruber asked there were any questions, and none were asked. Ms. Teich stated that all these projects are worthy but notes Sherburne County has not had federal funding from this program in the 20+ years she has been on the TAC. Ms. Teich motioned for \$1,135,120 to go to the City of Sauk Rapids and \$1,000,000 to go to Sherburne County. Steve Foss agrees with Ms. Teich and thinks the overall Federal funding amount is too small. Ms. Johnson asked the City of Sauk Rapids and Sherburne Country to confirm they agree with the dollar amounts suggested by Ms. Teich. Mr. Witter is in favor of accepting the \$1,000,000 for Sherburne Country. Mr. Hedlund agreed to the \$1,135,120 for the City of Sauk Rapids. Mr. Byrd noted that the projects getting funding are still underfunded and there is not enough Federal funding available.

Ms. Teich made motion for \$1,135,120 to go to the City of Sauk Rapids and \$1,000,000 to go to Sherburne County. Mr. Byrd seconded the motion. Motion carried. Roll Call: Kedrowski- YES; Voss – Abstained; Foss – YES; Glaesman – YES; Sabart – YES; Noerenberg – YES; Byrd – YES; Witter – YES; Teich – YES; Hedlund – YES; Saehr – YES

FY 2025 Transportation Alternatives Prioritization

Ms. Johnson summarized that there were 16 applications received districtwide to compete for the \$1,600,000 available in fiscal year 2025 Transportation Alternatives funding. The Saint Cloud APO received one application from the City of Sartell. Ms. Gruber presented on transportation alternative project. The City of Sartell would like to complete four trail and sidewalk connections. They requested \$367,040 in Federal funding.

Ms. Teich made motion to assign the APO's 10 regional priority points to the City of Sartell's application. Mr. Witter seconded the motion. Motion carried. Roll Call: Kedrowski– YES; Voss – Abstained; Foss – YES; Glaesman – YES; Sabart – YES; Noerenberg – YES; Byrd – YES; Witter – YES; Teich – YES; Hedlund – YES; Saehr - YES

Other Business and Announcements

Mr. Voss wanted to discuss the methodology of the overall ranking of the projects in the event there is additional funding down the road. Ms. Johnson summarized how APO staff ranked each project. City of Sauk Rapids was ranked as the number one project.

Ms. Teich made a motion if there were any additional funding it would go proportionately to Sauk Rapids and Sherburne County, then additional funds beyond that would go to the second ranked St. Cloud 22nd Street project. Mr. Foss seconded the motion. Motion carried. The APO Policy Board met on February 11, 2021. The following is a summary of that meeting:

- 1. The Board agreed to **not waive our statutory tort limits** on liability coverage for our upcoming coverage renewal;
- 2. The Board approved technical corrections to the APO Stakeholder Engagement Plan;
- 3. The Board approved PM2, PM3, and Transit Safety Performance Targets;
- 4. The Board approved the **amendments and modifications to the FY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program**; and
- 5. Regarding the **Surface Transportation Block Grant Program**, the Board approved the following:
 - a. Sauk Rapids 2nd Ave South Reconstruction project was awarded \$1,135,120 in Federal funds;
 - b. Sherburne County's CR 65/45th Avenue Realignment project was awarded \$1,000,000;
 - c. If additional Federal funds are received, they will be divided proportionately between the two projects above until they reach the maximum 80% Federal participation rate;
 - d. If any additional Federal funds are received, they would be awarded to projects in the following order:
 - i. Saint Cloud's 22nd Street South reconstruction project
 - ii. Sartell's 15th Street North corridor construction
 - iii. Stearns County CSAH 81 resurfacing
 - iv. Stearns County CSAH 133 resurfacing
- 6. Regarding the **Transportation Alternatives Program**, the Board awarded 10 regional priority points to the Sartell project for various shared-use path and sidewalk connections throughout the city.

One of the responsibilities of the Saint Cloud Area Planning Organization (APO), as outlined by the Federal Government, is to develop and maintain a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is the document that programs federal funds for transportation improvements in the APO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA). Decisions about transportation investments require collaboration and cooperation between different levels of government and neighboring agencies and jurisdictions. As a document, the TIP reports how the various agencies and jurisdictions within the MPA have prioritized their use of limited Federal highway and transit funding.

The Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT) is requesting a change be made to the fiscal years 2021-2024 TIP. The MN 301 retaining wall restoration project (7109-08) is currently programmed as an \$800,000 state-funded project to be constructed in fiscal year 2021. The MnDOT Historic Roadside Property Program manager is requesting this project be moved to fiscal year 2022. In addition, MnDOT is proposing to increase the cost of this project to \$900,000. Fiscal constraint will be maintained.

In accordance with the APO's Stakeholder Engagement Plan, the proposed changes are an administrative modification and therefore do not require the 30-day public input process.

One of the responsibilities of the Saint Cloud Area Planning Organization (APO), as outlined by the Federal Government, is to develop and maintain a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is the document that programs federal funds for transportation improvements in the APO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA). Decisions about transportation investments require collaboration and cooperation between different levels of government and neighboring agencies and jurisdictions. As a document, the TIP reports how the various agencies and jurisdictions within the MPA have prioritized their use of limited Federal highway and transit funding.

To assist agencies and jurisdictions within the APO's MPA in the process of developing the fiscal year (FY) 2022-2025 TIP, APO staff had developed, and TAC representatives had approved the development schedule for the TIP.

In late January/early February 2021, the Metropolitan Planning Program Coordinator with Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT)'s Office of Transportation System Management (OTSM) begun working with Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs) across the state to more effectively align the TIP development process facilitate better coordination with MnDOT.

As a result, some slight modifications to the APO's TIP development schedule are being requested.

The following is a summary of those changes:

- July 14, 2021: APO staff submit draft TIP to 30-day public comment period. The 30day public comment period has been delayed by almost a month to accommodate any final changes primarily from MnDOT sponsored projects.
- Aug. 26, 2021: APO TAC reviews final draft of the TIP. Again, this has been delayed by approximately one month from the original schedule.
- Sept. 9, 2021: APO Policy Board approves final draft of the TIP. Again, this was delayed by approximately one month from the original schedule.

These changes, while delayed one month from the previously adopted schedule, will not jeopardize the incorporation of the APO's TIP into the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) nor will it impact approval of the STIP by Federal Highway and Federal Transit Administrations.

Staff in its September report to the TAC on the Active Transportation Plan (ATP) gave the findings from areawide data collection, the results of on-line surveys and other public comments. From the review of these findings and discussions with volunteer committees, a vision for the area's active transportation network was developed as follows:

The Saint Cloud MPA strives to provide a regionally-coordinated and well-maintained active transportation network allowing for safe, efficient, convenient, and comfortable walking and bicycling access to local and regional destinations for all users of all abilities.

This overarching vision statement is proposed as the guiding principle for active transportation in the region. The vision is a guide to project development and implementation from APO member jurisdictions relative to active transportation.

Drawn from this vision were a set of goals consistent with those outlined in the 2045 MTP and representing the desires and needs for furthering active transportation in the region. For each ATP goal, a set of measurable objectives was then carefully considered from which progress toward achieving goals can be monitored.

Goals and objectives for active transportation proposed for adoption by the APO are as follows:

Goal 1: Improve bicycle and pedestrian safety and comfort.

Objective 1.1: Reduce the number and severity of crashes involving pedestrians and people who cycle.

Objective 1.2: Improve the comfort level of active transportation facilities where necessary.

Goal 2: Improve active transportation connections to desired destinations.

Objective 2.1: Improve connectivity to high demand destinations for bicyclists and pedestrians.

Objective 2.2: Improve bicycle and pedestrian connections to and from a transit stop.

Goal 3: Improve the condition of active transportation infrastructure.

Objective 3.1: Improve the state of good repair for active transportation facilities.

Goal 4: Provide equitable access to active transportation facilities for all people of all abilities.

Objective 4.1: Provide comfortable facilities and access for people of all ages and abilities.

Objective 4.2: Improve access to active transportation facilities in areas with high concentrations of vulnerable and underserved populations.

Goal 5: Promote an interconnected regional active transportation network.

Objective 5.1: Improve connectivity across the planning area.

Objective 5.2: Improve connectivity with communities outside of the MPA's boundaries.

Adopting the goals and objectives will provide direction to the APO and its member jurisdictions in developing and prioritizing future investments in active transportation.

The first four of these goal statements and accompanying objectives reflect shared desires to address bicyclist and pedestrian safety needs, the places people need to reach, facility conditions and equitable access. They have applicability to both the region and to individual local jurisdictions.

Note that Goal 5 is specific to the APO region as a whole. Goal 5 recognizes the shared need for transportation connectivity that does not stop with jurisdictional lines and extends to communities beyond the limits of the MPA.

These goals and objectives provide the underlying framework for the analysis of areawide and local needs for bicycles, pedestrians, and other active transportation users. Once adopted, they will be incorporated into the ATP. Factors relative to each objective will identify areas of focus relative to gaps and other needs.

With goals and objectives in place, APO staff will next develop performance measures, using available data to determine how well objectives for active transportation are being addressed over time.

Requested Action: Recommend to the APO Policy Board adoption of the active transportation vision, goals and objectives.



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




Ownership of Active Transportation Facilities in Sauk Rapids








