The Active Transportation Small Group Advisory Committee acts as a working group and a resource for the ATAC in developing the APO's Active Transportation Plan. The Small Group Committee met on Feb. 12 to discuss roles and timeline, current regional plans, active transportation themes, and a plan for public outreach. The group met again on March 11 to further review the survey questions and other data collection efforts. Due to meeting restrictions, the group did not meet in April.


Figures attached provide the current regional context for active transportation, identifying current the active transportation system, transit facilities, and places where staff is collecting data from automated counters. Also attached are new maps from 2015-2019 crash data. Of note, data received from public safety reports indicate a growing number of fatalities and serious injuries to pedestrians over the past five years. A survey of pavement conditions for all shared use paths is being conducted by the Parks and Trails Council. Facility and safety data will be supplemented from other data collection activities (i.e., Streetlight, local studies) and information obtained from our public engagement process.


APO staff intends to complete much of its public outreach and the primary data collection that will inform those recommendations by October 2020. This information will be part of the analysis of existing conditions which will go into a report due in December. The current deadline for completing the staff analysis and recommendations for investments in active transportation is August 2021.

This process of early public engagement and data collection will help to inform an overall vision and goals for active transportation in the Saint Cloud region. We anticipate a vision framework that includes promoting bicycle and pedestrian trips and transit connections, improving safety, providing better multimodal options, expanding facilities, connecting network gaps, and assuring equitable access. As a means to validate whether these are desired outcomes, the APO must acquire meaningful data on existing local and regional conditions around bicycle and pedestrian usage and access to transit.

Staff will be reporting on this analysis to the ATAC and other groups in the months to come.






The process of identifying significant network gaps and other active transportation needs that will inform project development for the Active Transportation Plan will largely rely on the results of early public engagement through a new survey and an interactive mapping tool. ATAC members were notified of web links to the Active Transportation Survey and the Wikimap interactive mapping tool where area residents can identify specific routes, destinations and issues of concern. Both are intended to be completed together.

Staff is emphasizing the use of the new survey together with the mapping tool because public engagement and data collection opportunities are otherwise very limited. In the past, the APO has relied on person-to-person contact at events and other public venues. With current health restrictions, many of these opportunities are not available to us. Therefore, cooperation from our local partners to publicize the active transportation planning process and share these links to include local social media platforms is especially vital.

Of note, all comments received will be recorded within the final plan. Follow up will be provided if participants provide their contact information.

Saint Cloud APO staff are leading the development of Safe Routes to School (SRTS) plans for Saint Cloud School District's Oak Hill Community School and Kennedy Community School through a SRTS planning assistance grant from MnDOT. On March 10, APO staff met with the SRTS management team consisting of representatives from District 742, CentraCare, and Stearns County Public Health to review the scope of work and data collection tasks – including walking and biking audits to identify and assess school hazards, issues, and barriers for students walking or biking to school.

The process and timeline has since been modified from the original intent due to the COVID-19 health emergency. The principal data collection for SRTS planning which consists of observations at the site, student tallies and parent surveys was to have begun this spring. With the cancellation of on-site school activities, this of course has not occurred and it is unclear at this point when normal school activity will resume. Once we have better information when this may occur, we will be better able to give a report on the revised scope and timeline for these activities, including possible needs for volunteer assistance. In the meantime we continue to coordinate with District 742 staff and the SRTS planning team and will report to you with any updates.

ATAC Recommendations on Future Transportation Alternatives Projects

As a comprehensive, intergovernmental transportation planning agency for the Saint Cloud Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA), the Saint Cloud Area Planning Organization (APO) works with member agencies and jurisdictions to facilitate local, state, and Federal funds for programs and surface transportation improvement programs. In order to accomplish this, the APO is tasked with prioritizing projects that align with its long-range transportation vision for the region.

The Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) is a long-range, multimodal, surface transportation plan that identifies a regional vision for transportation and the steps necessary to achieve that vision. Part of those steps includes the identification of various transportation improvement projects within the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA).

In order to carry out the vision of the MTP, the APO develops and maintains a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP is a short-range (four year) programming document that reports on how the various agencies and jurisdictions within the Saint Cloud MPA have prioritized their use of limited Federal highway and transit funding. This document is updated on an annual basis.

Projects contained within the TIP must either be identified within the MTP or align closely with the goals and objectives of the MTP. In addition, these projects are funded in part by the Federal Government or are projects sponsored specifically by the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT).

One of the sources of transportation funding the Federal Government uses is Transportation Alternatives (TA). Projects eligible for TA include, but are not limited to, the creation of facilities for pedestrians and bicycles, environmental mitigation or habitat protection as related to highway construction or operations, as well as infrastructure and noninfrastructure related to Safe Routes to Schools (SRTS) activities. States and localities are responsible for a minimum 20 percent share of project costs funded through this program.

Every year, MnDOT received a projected TA funding target which is for four fiscal years out (example: this year we are looking at FY 2024). These funding targets are then divided amongst the Twin Cities metro and the greater Minnesota Area Transportation Partnerships (ATPs). The Central Minnesota ATP receives approximately \$1.6 million.

In order to be considered for TA funding within the Central Minnesota ATP, applicants must complete and submit a letter of intent to the MnDOT District 3. Once the letter of intent period has passed, District 3 staff distribute those letters to their respective regional planning body - Region 5 Development Commission, East Central Regional Development Commission (7E), Region 7W Transportation Policy Board, and the Saint Cloud APO.

The APO Senior Planner works with prospective applicants that have projects identified in the planning area on their applications which are due to MnDOT District 3 staff in early January.

All applications across the Central Minnesota ATP are scored and ranked by a committee comprised of regional planning representatives which includes one planner and one engineer from the Saint Cloud APO. Once these scores are compiled, a prioritized list is brought before the ATP board for approval and incorporation into the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) – a document similar to the TIP, but which encompasses the entire state of Minnesota.

Aside from participation in the ranking and scoring of all Central Minnesota ATP regional projects, the APO – along with the other regional planning bodies within the ATP – have a very minor role in addressing their own regional priorities for TA funded projects.

To address this concern, MnDOT District 3 has allowed for regions like the APO to assign regional priority points to projects being completed within their planning area. These points, combined with the average scores from the TA scoring committee and regional equity points, can influence the final score and ultimate ranking of a project. Regional priority points are assigned to the top two projects – the number one project receives 10 points, the number two project receives five.

Each regional planning body is able to rank their projects and assign these regional priority points accordingly.

At the APO, TA applicants within the MPA will have the opportunity to present on and answer questions pertaining to their proposed projects at the APO's January Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting. TAC members will be given the opportunity to discuss and ultimately recommend the assignment of regional priority points for proposed TA projects to the Policy Board.

Policy Board approval of the regional priority points will be submitted by the APO Senior Planner to MnDOT District 3 and will be factored into the scoring and ranking of TA projects within the Central Minnesota ATP.

If a project within the MPA is selected to receive TA funding from the Central Minnesota ATP, that project will be incorporated into the APO's TIP.

It was brought up internally after the allocation of the regional priority points for the fiscal year 2024 project submissions that members of the APO's Active Transportation Advisory Committee (ATAC) should have an opportunity to review and provide their recommendations to the TAC given the nature of this committee.

In looking at the timing of when approvals are needed, this is possible. However, there are some limitations in regards to providing information ahead of a potential ATAC meeting. As stated above, the TA applications are submitted to MnDOT District 3 staff typically by the first Friday of January. APO staff does not see the final applications submitted to the district (including those within the APO) until approximately mid-January, at the time when the TAC agenda needs to be sent out (10 days prior to the meeting).

If the ATAC were to provide feedback and recommendations, there are two concerns: 1) the lack of information made available ahead of a scheduled meeting and 2) the timing of the ATAC meeting in order to include the ATAC recommendations in the TAC's agenda packet. APO staff can work to coordinate as best they can with MnDOT District 3 staff to provide the application information at the meeting, but there will be an understanding that this information will **NOT** be made available to ATAC members in an agenda packet. APO staff will work with MnDOT District 3 staff to provide the necessary information as far in advance as possible.
